CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above findings of fact, the Board concludes that:

<u>Variance</u> – the variance <u>(does/does not)</u> meet all three of the following tests:

Unnecessary hardship

- For an area variance, unnecessary hardship exists when compliance would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose (leaving the property owner without any use that is permitted for the property) or would render conformity with such restrictions unnecessarily burdensome. The Board of Appeals must consider the purpose of the zoning restriction, the zoning restriction's effect on the property, and the short-term, long-term, and cumulative effects of a variance on the neighborhood, the community, and on the public interests. This standard reflects the new *Zievogel* and *Waushara County* decisions.
- For a use variance, unnecessary hardship exists only if there is no reasonable use of the property without the variance.
- A. Unnecessary hardship (<u>is</u>/is not) present in that literal enforcement of the terms of the Ordinance (<u>would</u>/would not) be unnecessarily burdensome to the applicant because of the present location of cottage, privacy as well as visual appeal.
- B. The hardship (<u>is</u>/is not) due to physical limitations of the property rather than the circumstances of the appellant because **they will have to give up tree screening and parking to make it compliant. It would not aesthetically improve the property.**
- C. The variances (will/will not) be contrary to the public interest and will observe the spirit of the ordinance, secure public safety, and welfare, and do substantial justice, because this improvement is not harmful to anyone, and it aesthetically improves the structure. Moving it to the new location will improve the layout of the buildings on the property, preserve historic building and make the appearance more pleasant. It will keep the building off the road from the safety standpoint.

ORDER AND DETERMINATION

Based on the above findings of fact, conclusions of law, and the record in this matter, the Board orders:

<u>Appeal/Interpretation</u> the Zoning Administrator's order/interpretation of the Zoning Ordinances or map is (affirmed/modified/reversed) and the administrator is ordered to:

<u>Variance</u> – the requested variance is denied/<u>granted</u>/granted-in-part) subject to the following conditions/mitigation:
