# VILLAGE OF EPHRAIM GREEN TIER AD-HOC COMMITTEE WORKING SESSION MINUTES THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 2024 – 8:00 AM - 9996 WATER STREET

## 1. Discussion and update on the Ephraim Wetlands:

A discussion was held regarding the Ephraim Wetlands. Brushing is to be completed by the Maintenance Department as the weather cools this fall. Mulch spreading will have to wait until spring; the Village mulch pile has been depleted. The brush pile will be ground in early spring so that the mulch can be spread on the still-hard ground at the Wetlands.

## 2. Discussion and update on Battery Recycling:

C. Nelson reported that it was not possible to work with Brown County for battery recycling. While it is possible to work with Going Garbage, it may be cost-prohibitive with the cost of one dollar (\$1.00) per pint of batteries.

The committee discussed promoting county-wide events in which village residents could easily recycle their batteries.

#### 3. Discussion and update on Clean Marina.

B. Nelson reported that the Village is now a certified Clean Marina. He noted the idea to obtain the certification started with the Green Tier Committee. The renewal cycle for certification is every five (5) years.

# 5. Discussion and update on Food Pantry Magnets:

Methner noted that the project is on hold until after the fall festivals.

C. Nelson suggested that they be included with the issuance of the STR renewals in November.

#### 6. Discussion and update on Bird City and Tree City Applications:

C. Nelson suggested a future review if the Bird City certification was worth the time and financial requirements. She noted the process to renew Tree City is simple and without cost.

# 8. Discussion and update on Green Tier Five (5) Year Recognition Letter:

C Nelson inquired if the Ephraim Business Council had considered a composting effort similar to Jacksonport for the Bondemarked Farmers Market. Methner noted that she would gather information from Lutsey.
